

Dear Parent or Guardian,

As you may be aware, the state of California requires all incoming 7th graders to show proof of Tdap and 2 MMR vaccines (or valid medical exemption) prior to attending 7th grade. We have enclosed detailed information regarding Tdap and MMR, as well as answers to frequently asked questions.

Our records show that your child is missing his/her Tdap vaccine and/or 2nd MMR vaccine. In order for your child to start 7th grade, you will need to do <u>one of the following before school begins</u>:

- A. Provide documentation showing that your child has all immunizations required.
- B. Submit a licensed physician's written statement of a permanent medical exemption for missing shot(s) and immunization records with dates for all required shots not exempted.

What is a medical exemption?

A medical exemption is a written statement from a licensed physician (M.D. or D.O.) which states:

- 1. That the physical condition or medical circumstances of the child are such that the required immunization(s) is not indicated.
- 2. Which vaccines are being exempted.
- 3. Whether the medical exemption is permanent or temporary.
- 4. The expiration date, if the exemption is temporary.

If your student has not yet received these immunizations, please contact your child's medical provider right away.

- If you do not have a medical provider, we have enclosed a list of Sacramento Area Community Immunization Clinics.
- If you do not have health insurance, you can get assistance with signing up for health insurance from Sacramento Covered at (866) 850-4321 or http://sacramentocovered.org/enroll.

This is also a good time to discuss any other immunization needs. Although Tdap and 2 MMRs are required for school entry, it is recommended that your child also obtain Meningococcal and HPV vaccines in this age group. Students entering 7th grade who do not meet the immunization requirements <u>will not be able to attend</u> <u>school</u>. Please bring a copy of your child's immunization record(s) or valid medical waiver to our front office before school begins.

Vaccine Requirements for 7th Grade Students

Tdap (Pertussis/Whooping Cough)

What Parents Need To Know

What is the pertussis booster requirement?

<u>All students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th gr</u>ade will need proof of an adolescent whooping cough booster immunization (called "Tdap"), or medical exemption, prior to attending school in the fall.

What if my child does not have proof of a Tdap shot before school starts?

Your child will not be able to start school until you submit the documentation for the Tdap requirement to the school.

Is there a grace period/extension to get the shot AFTER school starts?

No. Under current law, schools do not have the option to provide a grace period. All 7th grade students will need to show proof of Tdap immunization or submit a medical exemption before starting school in September.

What is Tdap and what are the diseases that the Tdap vaccine prevents?

Tdap is a booster vaccine for older children, adolescents, and adults. It safely protects against 3 dangerous diseases: tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough (also called pertussis).

- **Pertussis** also known as whooping cough, is a contagious disease that causes violent coughing fits that make it hard to breathe. It spreads easily when someone with the disease coughs or sneezes. The symptoms can last for months. Whooping cough is particularly dangerous for young babies.
- **Tetanus** causes a severe, painful tightening (spasms) of muscles, including of the jaw ("lockjaw") which can limit swallowing and breathing.
- Diphtheria- is a throat infection that can lead to breathing problems, paralysis, heart failure and death.

Do ALL 7th grade students need to get the pertussis immunization?

Yes. Unless they have a medical exemption, all students going into 7th grade must have proof of having had the Tdap booster shot, or a medical exemption. This includes current students, new students and transfer students in both public and private schools.

Many students have already received the vaccine and simply need to supply proof to the school, so check with your doctor or provider.

Why is the Tdap vaccine required?

This new requirement will help protect your child and others in your school and community from whooping cough. Whooping cough is a serious disease that causes coughing fits that can last for months. In recent years, whooping cough has been increasing in the United States. Whooping cough has been widespread in California and was responsible for 10 infant deaths in 2010.

When should my child get vaccinated with Tdap?

Now. Unimmunized children are at risk for catching pertussis, getting really sick and missing weeks of school. Besides protecting your child, you can also beat the back-to-school rush by making an appointment for your incoming 7th grader to get a Tdap booster shot now.

- Keep documentation of your child's Tdap booster shot in a safe place.
- Provide a copy to your child's current school now.



Vaccine Requirements for 7th Grade Students

MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)

What Parents Need To Know

What is the MMR booster requirement?

<u>All students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade</u> will need proof of having had a 2nd MMR vaccine or medical exemption, prior to attending school in the fall.

What if my child does not have proof of a second MMR shot before school starts?

Your child will not be able to start school until you submit the documentation for the second MMR requirement to the school.

Is there a grace period/extension to get the shot AFTER school starts?

No. Under current law, schools do not have the option to provide a grace period. All 7th grade students will need to show proof of that 2nd MMR immunization or submit a medical exemption before starting school in September.

What is MMR and what are the diseases that the MMR vaccine prevents?

MMR is a vaccine that prevents Measles, Mumps and Rubella. These diseases spread from person to person through the air. You can easily catch them by being around someone who is already infected.

- **Measles** virus causes rash, cough, runny nose, eye irritation, and fever. .It can lead to ear infection, pneumonia, seizures (jerking and staring), brain damage, and death.
- **Mumps** Mumps virus causes fever, headache, muscle pain, loss of appetite, and swollen glands. It can lead to deafness, meningitis (infection of the brain and spinal cord covering), painful swelling of the testicles or ovaries, and rarely sterility.
- **Rubella** also known as German Measles, Rubella virus causes rash, arthritis (mostly in women), and mild fever. If a woman gets rubella while she is pregnant, she could have a miscarriage or her baby could be born with serious birth defects.

Do ALL 7th grade students need to show proof of a 2nd MMR immunization?

Yes. Unless they have a medical exemption, all students going into 7th grade must have proof of having had that second MMR shot, or a medical exemption. This includes current students, new students and transfer students in both public and private schools.

Many students have already received the vaccine and simply need to supply proof to the school, so check with your doctor or provider.

Why is a second dose of MMR vaccine required?

Having a second dose of MMR increases immunity to the disease. In 2008, 2011, 2013 and 2014, there were more reported measles cases compared with previous years. CDC experts attribute this to more measles cases than usual in some countries to which Americans often travel (such as England, France, Germany, India, the Philippines and Vietnam), and therefore more measles cases coming into the US, and/or more spreading of measles in U.S. communities with pockets of unvaccinated people.

When should I get my child the second MMR vaccine?

Now. Your child may have already had the 2nd MMR vaccine. Check your child's vaccine record or check with your doctor. If your child has not had that 2nd MMR (or proof of immunity), it is vital that your child receive it as soon as possible (or a letter from your doctor stating your child has immunity as verified by a lab test).

- Keep documentation of your child's 2nd MMR shot in a safe place.
- Provide a copy to your child's current school now.

Eligibility Requirements

The SCUSD Free Immunization Clinic may administer vaccines to students who meet **all** of the following conditions:

- 1. Are entering or currently attend Early Kindergarten 12th grade at a SCUSD school
- 2. Are under 19 years old
- 3. Have Medi-Cal, no insurance, are Native American or Native Alaskan Students with private insurance must see their primary care provider.

What You Need to Bring

- All immunization records for the student
- Medi-Cal card (if applicable)
- Parent/Guardian must be present

SCUSD clinics do not offer appointments.

Vaccines are available on a first come, first serve basis. Your wait time will depend on the number of students ahead of you. **Please note:** last registration is 30 minutes before the end of each clinic to allow time to serve everyone.
